The third of several neighborhood meetings featuring different city departments and action planning sessions featured a general meeting of the Parkway Cherry Point Neighborhood Association



Ms. Betts, Parkway Cherry Point Neighborhood Association President started the meeting with prayer

- First thing on agenda is copy of minutes from the last meeting.
- Went over the minutes from last time, starting with the questions asked and answers given.
- Talked about the LAPD enforcement that was involved in the meeting.
- Certificate of Appreciation that was awarded from the city for folks that have shown appreciation and participation for a cleaner and more attractive environment. Presented and signed on April 17, 2017

Ms. Betts thanked everyone that came out and participated in the meeting and cleanup on April 24, 2017

- Ms. Betts stated that the last two meetings on the calendar will be planning for the future
- Next went over previous topics from before.
- Some of the things from police department, and animal codes and clean ups.
- Q: Has police been more attentive since the neighborhood meeting they attended?
  - A: No, on 5/2/2017. Even for a basic speaker in lawn that was causing noise
  - No fix from police and Officer White did not respond until 45mins later
  - Last week there was a gathering at the car wash: no police anywhere around there either. Not following area of concerns for the police.
  - Ms. Betts stated that she will talk to Officer White about this issue
- Q: Animal control issue being taken care of?

- A: One resident, in the last two weeks has been calling constantly about loose dogs and animals around the neighborhood
- Issue has not been resolved
- Ms. Betts stated that there are many organizations in East Lubbock that need to come together to help all at once
- A resident brought a new NAACP chapter that is a new organization in Lubbock
- Ms. Betts stated next neighborhood meeting will be with Wood Franklin, Public Works director
- Ms. Betts stated that for all the issues residents keep bringing up they have to keep on it and keep reporting it until it is taken care of
- Q: People dump stuff behind your house instead of locations given
  - A: Call 311 Silent waste and tell them so they know and can try and take care of it as soon as possible
